In 2008 Anne completed an MA in Educational Leadership and Management and she now works at Liverpool Hope University where she is Subject Lead for BA Music and Senior Professional Tutor in Music Education. Her main area of interest is primary music development and she recently completed an Educational Doctorate in building confidence in primary school trainee teachers to teach music.

Anne's passion is performing music with other people, whether it be in the university wind band (which she conducts) or in the classroom with trainees and/or children. She believes that everyone is a musician and that all teachers have the capacity to enjoy making music with their classes.
